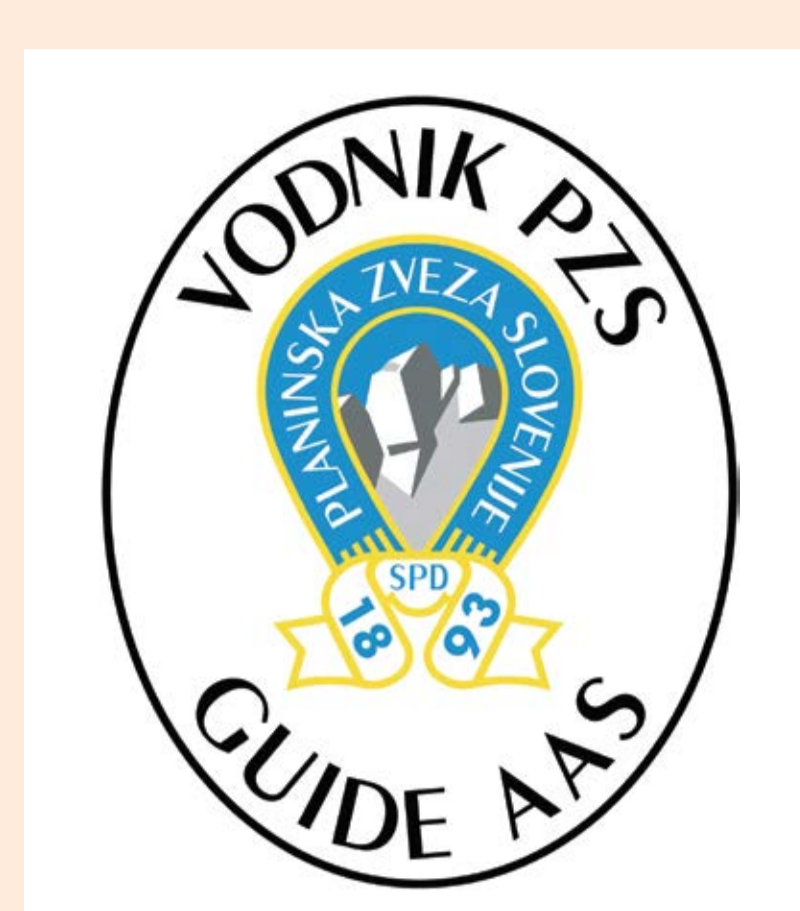


Prostovoljno vodništvo in turno kolesarstvo

Voluntary guiding and Alpine cycle-touring



PZS je nosilka in izvajalka 25 programov strokovnega usposabljanja, po katerih usposablja mentorje planinskih skupin, vaditelje orientacije, varuhe gorske narave, vodnike PZS za vodenje v kopnih in snežnih razmerah, turnokolesarske vodnike, alpiniste, markaciste, trenerje športnega plezanja in inštruktorje vseh vrst.

Vodniška komisija

V PZS je registriranih okoli 1500 prostovoljnih vodnikov PZS, ki se usposablajo v programih komisije in skrbijo za izvajanje planinskih aktivnosti v planinskih društvih.

Komisija za turno kolesarstvo

promovira turno kolesarstvo kot obliko gibanja v naravnem okolju in gorah, organizira skupne ture in tabore, vzpodbuja povezovanje turnokolesarskih odsekov znotraj planinskih društev in izvaja izobraževanja za prostovoljnega turnokolesarskega vodnika I. in II. stopnje. Komisija popularizira turno kolesarstvo tudi kot nadomestilo voženj z avtomobili s parkirišč v dolini do izhodišč za planinske ture.



The Alpine Association of Slovenia (Planinska zveza Slovenije) organizes and carries out 25 professional training programmes for mountaineering group mentors, navigation instructors, mountain nature protectionists, voluntary mountain guides for summer and winter mountain tours, alpine cycle-touring guides, alpinists, sports climbing instructors, and other qualified instructors.

The Commission for Voluntary Mountain Guides

is responsible for the operation and development of voluntary guiding and cooperation with professional organizations in Slovenia and abroad, in particular the UIAA. Moreover, it ensures the organizational, substantive and material conditions required for the operation and development of voluntary guiding as a form of mountaineering. Well-organized and professionally guided tours are the best way to make mountain walking safer for all alpine club members and other mountaineers. The Alpine Association of Slovenia has about 1,500 registered voluntary mountain guides, who are trained under the Commission programmes and carry out mountaineering activities in alpine clubs.

The Commission for Alpine Cycle-Touring

promotes alpine cycle-touring as a form of movement in the natural environment and in the mountains, organizes common cycle tours and camps, enhances cooperation among alpine cycle-touring sections active within alpine clubs, and carries out training for voluntary alpine cycle-touring guides of levels I and II. In addition, the Commission promotes alpine cycle-touring as an alternative to the use of cars to get from the parking areas in the valley to the starting points of mountaineering tours.
